Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

<u>Mass Requests</u> \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

<u>Communion Fast</u> Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Chapel Etiquette</u> Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

<u>OLHC</u> is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, the next blessing will be February 5th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

First Holy Communion will take place here at the 10:00 Mass of Sunday, May 7, 2023, the Fourth Sunday after Easter. If your child attends Padre Pio Academy, you should have received and email describing the details to be taken care of. If the child is schooled elsewhere, is 7 years of age or more, and of average intelligence, there are clipboard registration sign-up sheets on the giftshop counter. Please provide child's name and age, your name and your contact information (cell/email). There will be Sunday catechism classes, usually between Masses, courtesy of Mr. Jeff Nihill and Mr. Collin Hubbard. Your child must attend these classes to be included in this year's First Communion Class. If you or your older child have not received their First Holy Communion, you should register and talk with one of the teachers. Please do not delay; this is vitally important for the spiritual life of your soul.

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be administered here on Sunday, May 21, 2023, the Sunday within the Octave of the Ascension, at 10:00, at what we would expect to be a Pontifical High Mass. Again, if your child attends Padre Pio Academy, the details are outlined in the email. If the child doesn't attend PPA, there are NEW registration sheets on the counter in the giftshop. If you registered last autumn, (sorry!) you have to do it again! The Confirmation candidate will first pass a test on the Catholic Religion as well as providing Sacramental verification of Baptism and First Holy Communion from the parish(es) where these were administered. We would expect the candidate to be about 12 years of age. Now, if YOU, the parent, or are an adult who has not received Confirmation, now is your opportunity, indeed, your <u>duty</u>, to do so. Please then, also register for this imperative "rite de passage" of the Holy Catholic Faith!!!
