Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, the next blessing will be February 5th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Sexagesima Sunday (The strength of Christ is given to the humble soul) In today's Epistle, what a vivid picture the Apostle sets before us of his sufferings and toils. He even speaks of his visions received from Christ and the ineffable words "which it is not granted to man to utter." But after having recounted these titles to glory, the Apostle breaks the power of any sting of human vanity, preferring rather to glory in his own infirmities that the power of Christ might dwell in him. That is how humility speaks. It is neither in his talents, nor manifold works, nor suffering endured, labors accomplished, gifts received, but in his infirmities and weaknesses that St. Paul glories. Does he then deny his good works? On the contrary he draws the picture of them as no other apostle has ever done. Does he despise God's gifts? Oh no. He says: "We have received... the spirit that is of God; that we may know the things that are given us from God"; *Ut sciamus quae a Deo donata sunt nobis*. He knows these gifts, but it is that he may render thanks for them to the Father and His Son, Christ Jesus. It is in Christ's grace that he places all his glory, all his hope. ~ Dom Columba Marmion

During Lent we renew our commitment to follow Christ more closely; renouncing ourselves, taking our cross, following His footsteps. But do we think of the most obvious crosses which arise from our human nature weakened by original sin? There is the weakness of pride that seeks to dominate; fails to be considerate of others, exalting self above all others. There is the weakness of covetousness which is greed. "I want more and NOW!" There is the weakness of lust which is difficulty in ordering more base desires to practice the virtue of chastity. There is the weakness of envy, bringing sadness at the good fortune of others and jealousy, threatening my own excellence as blessings come to others. There is the weakness of gluttony finding difficulty in disciplining appetites in food, drink and comforts. There is the weakness of anger, rebelling against God and man because of circumstances or persons. There is the weakness of sloth – a distaste for spiritual things, even of work. All these weaknesses need discipline and so involve the cross. All Lenten penances, whether fasting, prayer or almsgiving have discipline as an end. Examine yourself honestly, then enter into the true spirit of Lent: denying yourself and taking up your cross to follow Christ. ~ from a very old church bulletin
