Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

<u>Confession Procedure</u> Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Chapel Etiquette</u> Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

To understand well the mystery of the temptation of Jesus, we must remember that Christ is like to us in all things: *Debuit per omnia fratribus similari, absque peccato.* Imagine to what a state of weakness a man would be reduced who allowed himself no nourishment for forty days. Our Lord did not will to work a miracle to prevent in Himself the effects of this fast, and the devil took occasion of His state of extreme exhaustion in order to tempt Him. If the Christ, the Incarnate Word, the Son of God, willed to enter into combat with the evil spirit, shall we be astonished if the members of His Mystical Body must follow the same path? Do not be surprised at temptation: never let us forget that Christ, our Model in all things, was tempted before us, and not only tempted, but touched by the spirit of darkness. Above all, do not let us forget that it was not only as the Son of God that Jesus overcame the devil, but likewise as Head of the Church; in Him and by Him we have triumphed, and we triumph still, over the suggestions of the rebel spirit. ~ Dom Columba Marmion

As we enter into the practices of the Lenten season, be not dismayed that you may not have planned the full course; it is not how you begin Lent, but rather how you finish it, as St Paul describes. Here is another round of specific practices to choose from if you still need focus: **Absinence**, usually redounds to the body's immediate appetite; legitimate or perhaps not so. Smoking, meat, sweets, between-meal snacks, favorite beverages: beer/soda/wine/"hard stuff"/coffee/tea, etc.

Fasting, you know the rules, but you may carry it beyond the rules with a single full meal and two other collations (together, not equaling the principle meal). **But**, Sunday is always a feast day, not a fast day, because one cannot feast and fast at the same time! **TV**, give.it.up! It used to be amusement, now it's mind control. **Prayer**, the daily Rosary, First Friday Mass, First Saturday Mass, an extra Mass during the course of the week. Adoration, or maybe just a visit to the Blessed Sacrament! A Holy Hour – could you not watch one hour with Me? Bishop Sheen made this the center of his daily devotions immediately after Mass. PRAY for the souls in purgatory (soon to be you!) Pray for an end to any or all the evils in the world. **Confession**, weekly or frequently; just ask the saints! This is one of the best ways to make spiritual progress because you stay focused on your shortcomings. **Daily examination of conscience**, know your faults, then present them at your next confession. **You don't have to do it all**, just choose a series of these items which you feel apply to you and persevere unto the end!!!
