Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor. **OLHC** is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, the next blessing will be June 4th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Confirmation is next Sunday at the 10:00 Mass expect it to be very crowded. The following is important information for our Confirmation families, particularly as the Ceremony will be here in our Chapel.

Confession: Confirmands should go to confession within the week preceding reception of the Sacrament. There will be confessions Saturday, May 20 from 4 – 5PM; and also before Confirmation on Sunday BUT YOU WILL BE CUTTING IT VERY SHORT!

Mandatory practice: Following Saturday confessions, there will be mandatory Confirmation practice at 5:30PM, lasting about 45 minutes.

Sunday Confirmation: The confirmands and their sponsors are to be at the Chapel at 9:00AM. Please be on time!!!

Dress Code Information for Confirmands AND sponsors:

Dress shoes are required for ALL confirmands and sponsors! NO sneakers, tennis shoes or sandals.

Men and boys: A dark suit or sport jacket and a tie. No sweaters please.

Ladies and girls: A modest dress is a must: **white or pastel** with the skirt at least four inches below the knees when standing. Modesty is not demonstrated by long slits in skirts higher than four inches below the knee. The collar line should be **no lower** than two inches below the pit of the neck. Dresses which are sleeveless or with "cap sleeves" do not meet the norm of modesty and should not be worn.

Veils: Girls will be required to wear white veils, which cover the hair. Nothing transparent or too tight is permitted.

Make-up: Women and girls to be confirmed are not to wear any make-up, lipstick or earrings. No other facial or ear ornamentation will be allowed.

Special Note: This dress code also applies to sponsors. Moreover, any guest, regardless of their religion, must follow the standard dress code. It is the responsibility of the candidate and his parents to inform the guests whom they invite of this dress code. No one will be admitted who is not dressed in accordance with the Church dress code.

Stipends: All confirmands are asked to present a stipend of at least \$20 which will be given to the Bishop to help defray his expenses. You may also Venmo Our Lady Help of Christians (information and QR code is in this bulletin.) Or you may put it in the Sunday collection or drop it in the Principal's mail slot in the breezeway.

This week brings Ascension Thursday forty days after the Resurrection of Our Lord. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses at Our Lady Help of Christians are, 7:00AM, 9:00AM and an evening Mass at 7:00PM.

It is also the occasion of the third Deliverance Mass of nine which will be celebrated by Father Lawrence Smith with the intention of deliverance of our loved ones and ourselves from the influence, assaults and tyranny of Satan and his demons. All parishioners have been enrolled in general. To participate in the graces, attend Mass or make a spiritual communion; include these intentions in your daily Rosary and pray the Novena to the Immaculate Conception from November 29 through December 7.
