**Modesty in Church** Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

**Communion Fast** Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

**Confession Procedure** Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

**Mass Requests** \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

**Chapel Etiquette** Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

**OLHC** is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

**No unapproved literature** may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

**Need something blessed?** The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, which is today! The next blessing will be July 2nd. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

**Lost and Found** If you have lost something, check the lost and found bin and if you find something left in the pews, please return it to the bookstore so it can find its rightful owner.

**The Stanford Achievement Test Series**, taken by millions of students every year, is used to measure academic knowledge of elementary and secondary school students, from kindergarten through high school. The subtests are broken down into subjects such as reading, comprehension, mathematics, problem-solving, language, spelling, listening comprehension and science. The test scores are used to determine the level of instruction for which a student is prepared. High scores indicate mastery of their grade level material, while low scores may indicate a need for remedial instruction. The students of Padre Pio Academy took the "Stanford 10" tests in late March with the following results. The left column indicates the approximate grade level; while the right column is their grade operational level:

**As long as we're investigating academic achievement**, here's "a little night music" for you! There was a study from the '90's, later expanded upon, called the "Mozart effect." A woman with child, it seems, by listening to Mozart, will stimulate development of neural pathways in her baby. A reasonable assumption, since further investigations suggest that Mozart listeners of a young age, are typically more creative, intelligent and better achievers in school. As a corollary, a "higher form of music" leads to an early appreciation of Traditional, Latin sacred music. How can you lose? You don't have to wear a tuxedo to listen to the Masters; some of it is downright "catchy" even familiar. Stumped? Try these: Mozart/Eine Kleine Nachtmusik, Piano Variations, Piano Sonatas, Ave Verum Corpus (Youtube: Bernstein conducting!!!); Bach/Brandenburg Concertos; Vivaldi/Four Seasons.
