<u>Modesty in Church</u> Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

<u>Communion Fast</u> Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

<u>Confession Procedure</u> Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Mass Requests</u> \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

<u>Chapel Etiquette</u> Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

Commemoration of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel – July 16

Today is the principal feastday of the Carmelite Order. Through the efforts of the crusader Berthold, a group of hermits living on Mount Carmel were organized into an Order, after the traditional western type, about the year 1150. Oppressed by the Saracens, the monks slowly emigrated to Europe. During the night preceding July 16, 1225, the Blessed Virgin is said to have commanded Pope Honorius III to approve their foundation. Since the Carmelites were still under constant harassment, the sixth General of the Order, St. Simon Stock, pleaded with the Blessed Virgin for some special sign of her protection. On July 16, 1251, she designated the scapular as the special mark of her maternal love. That is why the present feast is also known as the Feast of the Scapular. The scapular, as part of the habit, is common to many religious orders, but it is a special feature of the Carmelites. A smaller form of the scapular is given to lay persons in order that they may share in the great graces associated with it. Such a grace is the "Sabbatine privilege." In the so-called, Bulla Sabbatina, John XXII affirmed that wearers of the scapular are soon freed from the flames of purgatory, at least by the Saturday after death. The latest confirmation of the Bulla Sabbatina was promulgated by the Sacred Congregation of Indulgences, July 4, 1908.

Application: The Blessed Virgin's scapular should remind us that Christians have an apostolate against current extremes and extravagances in modes of dress. Clothes are a symbol of the person. Like the Christian heart, dress must be chaste and simple, for one judges the interior from the exterior. It should not be necessary to add that special attention be given this matter when preparing for church attendance. ~ Pius Parsch: *Year of Grace*

"I am the Mother of fair love, and of fear... and of holy hope." In the strict sense, these words are to be understood of Eternal Wisdom. But the Holy Church applies this text also to Mary. Being Mother of Eternal Wisdom, that which is true of Christ in an absolute manner, is likewise true of her, all due proportion guarded, because the same gifts have been conferred by Jesus on His Mother.

Mary is the immaculate type of pure humanity, the masterpiece of all creatures. The fount of all the gifts which she has received is none other than her prerogative of Mother of Eternal Wisdom. Mary has received from the Father the most perfect heart of a mother. Never was there in this heart the least shade of egoism, it is a marvel of love, a treasury of grace: *gratia plena*. This heart was not only fashioned for Christ (Who come to His own, was not received by them, and Who was to find a compensation of love in His Mother) but also for that other Christ, the Mystical Body of Jesus. Mary embraces Christ and His members in the same love. ~Dom Marmion: *Revue Liturgique et Monastique*
