Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, the next blessing will be September 3rd. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

The Padre Pio Academy fall semester begins on September 6. That's only 432 hours away for those students (and mothers) keeping track!!! During the course of the year PPA often resorts to pizza parties in recognition of a variety of achievements. People are usually amazed at how we can fill so many bellies with so much pizza! Well, there is a trick to it: we save Proof of Purchase tabs from Little Caesar's Pizza boxes, and you can help us out. Next time you order a Little Caesar's Pizza for take-out, look for the tab on the lid that says, Proof of Purchase. Clip it off and bring it to PPA, or even drop it in the collection – it will get to where it's supposed to go! After we collect a bagful, we call up Little Caesar and, poof! PIZZA PARTY!!! On a larger scale, there's another way you might be able to help the Academy. We run on a limited budget with limited staff – some of them mothers even, with children in the Academy. Over the course of the academic year there arises an occasional need for a substitute teacher to cover for a sick teacher or who may have a sick child and cannot come in. When this happens, we like to have a list of people who can sub for a teacher on short notice. If this is a volunteer position you might be interested in, there is a sign-up sheet on the giftshop counter. School hours are Monday thru Thursday, 8:15 – 2:45 and Fridays 8:15 – noon. Confirmation, and First Confession – First Communion classes will begin on Sunday, September 10th, right here, in one of the Academy classrooms, hosted by our intrepid teachers, Mr. Jeff Nihill and Mr. Collin Hubbard. Classes will meet on Sundays only, between the two Masses, at about 8:45AM. If you or your children are in need of these Sacraments, you should enroll today or any forthcoming Sunday. Enrollment sheets are to be found in the breezeway. First Communion students must have a copy of the *Saint Joseph First Communion Catechism* and a pocket folder for the hand-outs. These classes are open to baptized children of about seven years of age.

Caritas Super Omni – "Charity Above All" is the motto of our friend and former associate pastor, Father Lawrence Smith, now living in Pleasant Prairie, WI. Over the course of the year, Fr. Smith offers a series of nine, a novena of Masses, to "lay siege to heaven" in the phrase of St Catherine of Siena, in order to obtain that which men on earth might otherwise despair of receiving. These Masses are offered for the intention of the deliverance of our loved ones (and/or ourselves) from the influence, assaults, and tyranny of Satan and his demons.
