Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, which is today! The next blessing will be Sunday, October 1st. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Padre Pio Academy opens its doors for the Fall Term of 2023, this Wednesday, September 6th at 8:15 in the morning. We hope your children are prepared to make lots of new friends, greet the many old friends and strive to make a consummate success of the academic year!!! Over the past few weeks we've detailed various ways in which everyone can help us out financially with little or no expense to themselves. Aside from these "brainless fundraisers" we also host major events which help keep Academy tuition and maintenance down to an affordable level. The first of these events of the school year is our annual **Fall Festival** – just around the corner on **Sunday, October 22nd!** Previously, it was aptly nicknamed "Oktoberfest" (no doubt because it fell in Oktober!) but it has since been rebranded to **Fall Festival** just for a clean, new look! All the fun things that everyone enjoyed so much in the past will still be there: assorted food – from east to west to south, assorted drinks from hot to cold to "verry cold". There will be a wide range of games and diversions for the youngsters, among them: jumpers, basketball, face painting, balloon animals and more! There will be adult diversions too, for those feeling lucky: a Silent Auction, a 50/50 Raffle, and everyone's all-time favorite, the **\$Ten Thousand Dollar Raffle!!!** As usual this raffle will feature three winners: \$7000, \$2000 and \$1000 – totaling \$10,000! As the PPA Fall Semester convenes, please keep in mind that we want YOU, particularly if you enjoy students' company for more than seconds on end, can follow a "forward lesson plan" for a day, and would like to help us to keep the academic ball rolling: we have a need for substitute teachers over the course of the year. If you have the inclination, interest and occasional time, we need you to add your name to the list of potential teacher substitutes on the giftshop counter so we can schedule a chat. First Confession – First Communion, and Confirmation classes will begin on Sunday, September 10th, in the Academy classrooms, hosted by our sacramental teachers, Mr. Collin Hubbard and Mr. Jeff Nihill. Classes meet on Sundays only, between the two Masses, so at about 8:45AM. If your children (or you) are in need of these Sacraments, you should enroll them today or on any forthcoming Sunday using the sheets found in the breezeway or giftshop. First Communion students must have a copy of the *Saint Joseph First Communion Catechism* and a pocket folder for the lesson hand-outs. These classes are open to baptized children of about seven and older. Keep in mind, the classes meet for only an hour per week. That means they will continue over the course of several months, thus there is a degree of dedication involved from the outset.
