

Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, that's today! The next blessing will be January 7th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Friday, December 8th Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary,(Patroness of the United States of America). Holyday of Obligation Morning Masses are at 7:00 and 9:00AM; Evening Mass is at 7:00PM.

Friday, December 22nd, Morning Mass at 8:15AM

Saturday, December 23rd, Morning Mass at 8:00AM

Sunday, December 24th, Morning Masses at 7:30 and 10:00AM. This day is Christmas Eve, the Vigil of the Nativity of Our Lord, as well as the Fourth Sunday of Advent.

The Masses for **Christmas Day, Monday, December 25th** are only two: Midnight Mass at 12:00AM (That is to say, the very late evening of Sunday) Morning Mass at 9:00AM (Please note: this is the **only** Mass of Christmas morning)

The remaining Sundays of December will see the usual morning Masses at 7:30 and 10:00AM. The hours for Confession remain the same.

The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe will be observed on Tuesday, December 12th. There will be no Mass, but the Academy students will still have their annual procession around the grounds in honor of Our Blessed Mother, from 9:45 – 10:00AM. The students prepare makeshift altars, decorate them abundantly with flowers and process from altar to altar, singing hymns and then praying a decade of the Rosary at each altar. Everyone is invited to join us!
