**Modesty in Church** Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

**Communion Fast** Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

**Confession Procedure** Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

**Mass Requests** \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

**Chapel Etiquette** Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

**OLHC** is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

**No unapproved literature** may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

**Need something blessed?** The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be February 4<sup>th</sup>. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

**Lost and Found** Please remember to identify your Missals and prayer books for a safe return. If you have lost something, check the lost and found bin in the bookstore and if you find something left in the pews, please return it to the bin to find its rightful owner.

**Michael Soto Day is Tuesday, January 30.** Michael Soto was a graduate of Padre Pio Academy, having studied here throughout his entire educational career. Certainly a source of great pride for him was serving Mass for Father Fred Schell with his brother Joe. This was years before OLHC, back when we were "roamin'" Catholics, going from venue to venue, auditorium to auditorium, with a congregation of some 200+ souls, all attached to the Traditional Mass. After graduating, Michael joined the workforce but fell ill and, all too soon for his family and friends, was called home by his Heavenly Father; the first of our graduates thus, so far as we know. *Fiat mihi secundum verbum tuum.* For many, many years, "his day" was observed by Padre Pio Academy firstly as a means for his classmates to mourn his passing, and perhaps even more importantly even for today's young students, as a spiritual understanding, that we know not the day nor hour of our summons. On that Tuesday, everyone is invited to join the Padre Pio Student Body attending a memorial Requiem Mass at 8:15AM in this Chapel for the repose of Michael's soul. Immediately thereafter students adjourn to Fr. Schell Hall for a light breakfast, a milk and donuts sort of thing. By 10:00 we'll be caravanning to Holy Sepulcher Cemetery near E. Chapman Avenue in the foothills, where a Rosary will be recited at Michael's graveside. Our spiritual considerations complete, we'll head back to the Academy; but the day is not over! Shortly after our return, students will enjoy a communal luncheon of pizza, provided by the Soto Family!!! In addition to Michael Soto Day, it is also Wheel Day which begins immediately after lunch! Children may bring their bikes, scooters, skateboards, roller skates (you name it) to school that day, and spend the balance of the time wheely-ing, brody-ing and speeding around the parking lot!!! **School will be dismissed at 2:00PM.** Does this sound like a well-rounded day; a day you would like your children to experience? Perhaps you should contact our offices and schedule a talk with our staff about enrolling your children at Padre Pio Academy.

**What a glorious sight it will be,** to see this kingdom subject to Jesus, to contemplate the work of His Blood and His grace, offered by Christ Himself to the glory of His Father! The Church triumphant will contemplate the glory of her Head; she herself will be filled with the fulness of joy.
