<u>Modesty in Church</u> Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

<u>Communion Fast</u> Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

<u>Confession Procedure</u> Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Mass Requests</u> \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

<u>Chapel Etiquette</u> Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

**<u>OLHC</u>** is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

**Need something blessed?** The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be March 3rd. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

**Ash Wednesday** is this week, February 14. There will be blessing and distribution of ashes at the 8:15 morning Mass, as well as a 7:00PM evening Mass also with distribution of ashes. If you are unable to attend either of these services, ashes will be distributed also after Masses next Sunday. What? Ash Wednesday? Already?? NOO0000000! I'm not ready (again)!:

A Christian is a follower of Christ, Who left no doubt as to the one absolute condition required of His followers: "Let him renounce himself, take up his cross and follow me." During Lent we renew our commitment to Christ: to follow Him more closely; renouncing ourselves, taking up His cross, walking in His footsteps. What makes up that cross? Immediately we think of sickness, all misfortunes, burdens of work, bearing with one another's faults, heat of summer, cold of winter. But seldom so we think of the more obvious crosses arising from a human nature weakened by original sin. There is the weakness of pride that seeks to dominate; fails to be considerate of others; exalting self above all others. There is the weakness of covetousness which is greed: "I want more and want it now." There is the weakness of lust which is difficulty in ordering myself as God intended and to practice the virtue of chastity. There is the weakness of envy which brings sadness at the good fortune of others and jealousy that sees a threat to my own excellence in the blessings that come to others. There is the weakness of <u>aluttony</u> which finds difficult to discipline appetites for food, drink and creature comforts. There is the weakness of anger, a rebellion against God and others because of circumstances or persons. There is the weakness of sloth: a distaste for spiritual things, prayer/Mass/confession, or an aversion for work. All these weaknesses need discipline and so involve the cross. All our penances of Lent, whether fasting, prayer or almsgiving, have this discipline as an end. Unless they are directed to this end, we are just going through the motions of Lent and we are no more a "Christian" at Easter than we are now. Examine yourself honestly. See where discipline is needed in your life. Then enter into the true spirit of Lent – denying yourself and taking up your cross to follow Christ. ~ Father Raymond Zweber (RIP)
