Maunder Thursday, March 28: 6:00 PM: Confessions; 7:00 PM: Mass of the Lord's Supper

Good Friday, March 29: 12:00 PM: Confessions; 1:00 PM Stations of the Cross; 2:00 PM: Readings, Veneration of the Cross, Mass of the Presanctified

Holy Saturday Evening, March 30: 9:30 PM: Confessions; 10:30 PM: Blessing of the New Fire and Paschal Candle, Readings, Litany; 11:45: Mass at Midnight begins. This Mass fulfills one's Sunday obligation.

Easter Sunday, March 31: Masses at 7:30 and 10:00 AM, both preceded by Confessions

As a corollary to next Sunday, families, please don't forget our very special *Easter Egg Hunt*, right here on our front lawn after the 7:30 Mass! This has become an annual tradition – some of the shorter people among us think it should be a weekly tradition, but how can you blame them? It's fun, it's exciting and you never know where you're going to find the next prize! Remember to bring sturdy baskets for your children.

Did someone say, JOG-A-THON? Said or unsaid, ready or not, it is upon us! The first week is already in the barrel with these amazing results: Total raised - \$7468 of a \$25,000 goal! Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be April 7th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.
