

Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass which is today, The next blessing will be April 7th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

It is with great sadness that we announce the death of Agnes Therese Selway of San Jose, California, who passed away on February 9, 2024, at the age of 73. She is survived by her children, Taryn (Sr. Mary Xavier, F.M.), Matthew (Missy), Aimee (Curtis) Schaper, Luke (Julie), Fr. Benjamin Selway, C.S.P.V, Jack (Madeline), Katie (Vince) Cortese, Daniel (Bernadette), and Madeline (Sr. Mary Raphael, F.M.) She is also survived by 52 grandchildren; and 7 great-grandchildren. Agnes was predeceased by her husband Jim. Previously from Orange County, Jim, Agnes and their children were staple features at Father Schell's Mass as well as at Padre Pio Academy for many, many years.

Agnes passed away peacefully in her home, fortified with the Sacrament of Extreme Unction and the Apostolic Benediction, and after having patiently suffered for many years from rheumatoid arthritis and lung disease, she passed to her heavenly Father while her children were praying the Rosary at her side.

Agnes was a hard-working, generous and unselfish mother, who trained her children to value the Faith as she did, and to live by the Commandments, teaching them generosity, prayer, and proper conduct – "Rosary first, then fun." A Salesian spirit of joy and happiness permeated their home. Everyone was welcome into the Selway's all-American family for sports, barbeques, games and laughter.

Deeply pious, Agnes prayed the Rosary every day, spent many hours before the Blessed Sacrament, and attended Mass several days a week. She was faithful to First Fridays and First Saturdays, and transferred to her children these devotions. As the years went on, she continued reminding her family of days of fast and other religious obligations, even sending group texts to this effect shortly before her death. With her great esteem for religious, she fasted and offered many Holy Hours to foster vocations in her family. Her prayers were certainly answered as one son is a priest of the Congregation of St. Pius V in Round Top, NY, and two daughters are professed Sisters of the Daughters of Mary, Mother of Our Savior. Five grandchildren have also entered the religious life.

Agnes not only loved God, but her neighbor as well. Funny and practical, she easily made friends wherever she went. From New York to California, no one was a stranger to her. She was large-hearted and generous, always ready to lend a hand at church and school – driving priests, ironing church linens, assisting the girls' sodality, substituting for teachers, driving for field trips, and serving hot lunches. She often gave to the needy and contributed to her favorite charities.

Agnes suffered greatly for many years from a chronic cough which progressively worsened over the years. Despite her sickness, she still thought of others, and her sense of humor and witty words never failed her. Her greatest suffering during this time was the inability to attend Mass and receive Holy Communion frequently. Requiescat in pace.
