Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be June 2nd. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a mighty wind coming.

Consider these words individually. "There came a sound," which was heard in all Jerusalem. Whence comes it that your zeal in the service of God is so little perceptible? Whence, but because you do not allow the Holy Spirit full sway in your heart, and raise up obstacles to His gracious operations. This sound arose "suddenly," in token that the visitations of the Holy Spirit are not limited to any appointed time; that He comes when and how He wills. Wherefore, Christ says, "the Spirit breatheth where He will." You should therefore continually pray for the Holy Spirit, and ever be prepared for His coming; leaving to Him the time, in the firm conviction that He will come at the season best fitted for you. The sound came "from Heaven," to signify that "every best gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights." Therefore look upon every inward illumination and every incitement to good as a precious gift from Heaven, and use it to your eternal welfare. Furthermore, the sound was as, "of a mighty wind coming;" signifying that the operation of the Holy Spirit in the hearts of men, resembles the effects of wind in nature; wind purifies the air, tempers heat, and drives away clouds and dust. Thus does the Holy Spirit purify the heart from sin, moderate the heat of our passions, and expel sinful desires. Daily entreat the Holy Spirit to bring forth in you the fruits of grace.
