Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, that's today. The next blessing will be July 7th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Reflections on the Feast of Corpus Christi by Nicholas Avancinus S.J.:

The most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar is called the Bread of Angels; not because the Angels feed upon it, but because those who receive it worthily become like Angels. What happiness for you, if in this mortal life you could be freed from the burden of the flesh, and become wholly spiritual; if no temptation could entangle you, no passion disturb your inward peace. If you cannot enjoy this happiness in some measure, it is your own fault; you partake too seldom, or without due preparation, of the Bread of Angels. Correct yourself in this respect; communicate very often, and each time with a pure heart, penetrated by fervent love. You will thus more entirely divest yourself of earthly and sensual things, and soar up to the perfection of the Angels.

Holy Communion operates so as to cause us to become children of God. As a child of God you obtain the right of inheritance; wherefore the Apostle says, "If sons, heirs also; heirs indeed of God, and joint heirs with Christ." How great the grace of which we become partakers in Holy Communion! Consider what it is to have God for your Father and Jesus Christ for your Brother. But, alas, how little have you endeavored to conduct yourself as becomes a child of God and a brother of Jesus Christ. Deplore your carelessness, coldness, ingratitude, and earnestly strive to live that you may be worthy of being called a child of God and a brother of Jesus. In every Communion resolve to love God, your Heavenly Father, with a childlike love, and zealously to follow in the steps of your Brother, Jesus Christ.

A yet greater grace is yours in Holy Communion: you not only become a child of God, but one with God; for He abideth in you, and you in Him. But in order to effect this union, it is necessary that your whole self should die in you, and God alone should live in you. When will the time come when you can with truth say, "I live, but not I, Christ lives in me."? Lay aside your earthly mind, sit loose from everything which binds you to the world, curb your self-love and all your inordinate affections, and offer yourself in sacrifice to Jesus, without reserve; then will He begin to live in you, and impart to you in abundance the treasures of His love and grace.
