Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, the next blessing will be July 7th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Reflections on The Baptist by Fr. Nicholas Avancinus S.J. ~

John appears both as Prophet and Apostle, foretelling the coming of the Messiah and bearing witness to Him when present. God, having called him to be the forerunner of His Son, he seizes joyfully the first opportunity of preaching Christ. Would that you displayed the like zeal in the duties of your calling! God will require of you a strict account of these duties, and should you be guilty of neglecting them, you can only expect the fate of the slothful servant, who buried his talent in the earth. John does not draw the attention of the Jews to himself, but to Jesus; Him alone should they honor and love; to Him alone should they cleave; to Him alone should they look for salvation. You also in all your works, must seek Jesus, not yourself; your sole study must be to promote His glory.

Reflect on the words of John's testimony, designating Jesus as "the Lamb," to recall to our minds the words of the Prophet, "I was a meek lamb, that is carried to be a victim." He calls Him "the Lamb of God," thereby bearing witness to His Divinity. He adds, "Who taketh away the sin of the world," by these words indicating the end for which Jesus came into the world. Contemplate the meekness, patience and obedience of Jesus, the Lamb of God, and earnestly resolve to practice these virtues. Jesus offered up Himself for you; offer up yourself also in sacrifice to Him, and slay before Him your self-love and all the inordinate affections of your heart. Rejoice that Jesus, the Lamb of God, has taken away sin, and put your whole trust in Him. Be yourself also a lamb taking away sin: from your own soul by sincere penance, from your fellow-men by correction, good example and prayer.

SACRAMENTAL PLANNING OLHC's autumn First Communion class will begin on Sunday, September 8, the feast of the Nativity of Our Blessed Mother. This class is geared for children of about 7 years or above and of average intelligence. If you have a child who needs to make his First Communion, he will need a St. Joseph First Communion Catechism book and a pocket folder to hold notes and hand-outs, as well as a Baptismal Certificate. Classes start at 8:45AM and last about an hour. Parents are asked to be present on the first day with their children in order to meet Mr. Hubbard, our instructor. There will be a sign-up sheet in the giftshop in the coming weeks. A Confirmation class is also in the planning - more information to come. That said, if you are an adult and have yet to receive these sacraments, you should make plans to do so. If you have not been baptized, please call the Sacramental Planning number on the front page.
