Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be July 7th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

On the Sacred Heart ~ Fr. J. P. Arendzen (1935)

What is this devotion to the Sacred Heart but the outcome of our deep affection and passionate faith in the true humanity of Jesus our Lord? We know He became like unto us in all things except in sin. How could this be better expressed than saying: In His bosom there throbs a heart like unto ours? On every statue of the Sacred Heart, Jesus shows upon His breast that central symbol of emotional love, which says to us: You are human and so am I; you love those who are dear to you; your heart thrills when moved with the love of your brethren. Your heart is hurt by lack of gratitude; how much more was Mine, when the lance of the soldier laid it open and forthwith there flowed forth blood and water, showing to all the world that I died from a broken heart!

But I retook it as My living heart to be Mine, that I might love you with it humanly forever and ever. As man, I stand before you and beg return for the immensity of My affection for you.

Our faith answers, realizing that *HIS* human love is vast as the ocean, deep as the abyss and high as the mountains, far beyond what our narrow hearts can grasp. And yet if He, who thus humanly loves us, were not God, the love of His Sacred Heart would have only a limited value for us, as the love of a mere man, noble and great, kind and generous, unselfish, self-sacrificing, whom we could love and be grateful to, but in the end, only a creature like ourselves.

But, the Heart of Jesus is the Heart of God! As the adorable Face of Christ is the Face of God, so His pierced hands and feet are the Hands and Feet of God, Who in His manhood died for us on the cross. Thus the Heart of Jesus is the Heart of God! 'Adorable Heart of my God, instrument of Divine tenderness of God to me, I kneel, adore and give Thee worship, for it is the Uncreated, Eternal, Infinite Lover to whom I pay my grateful homage for having chosen these means to persuade me of the true love of God.' So prays everyone: who grasps what is meant by the worship of the Sacred Heart; so thinks everyone: who has understood the message which Christ gave to St. Margaret Mary centuries ago. May we each, throughout life and in the hour of death, continue to repeat a myriad times: Dear Heart of Jesus, I implore that I may love You more and more.
