Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be August 4th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

The Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel was celebrated last week, and although passed, its richness and significance are enduring and essential. "It is the principal feastday of the Carmelite Order. Through the efforts of the crusader Berthold, a group of hermits living on Mount Carmel were organized into an Order after the traditional Western type about the year 1150. Oppressed by the Saracens, the monks slowly emigrated to Europe. During the night preceding July 16, 1225, the Blessed Virgin is said to have commanded Pope Honorius III to approve the foundation. Since the Carmelites were still under constant harassment, the sixth General of the Order, St. Simon Stock, pleaded with the Blessed Virgin for some special sign of her protection. On July 16, 1251, she designated the scapular as the special mark of her maternal love. That is why the present feast is also known as the Feast of the Scapular. The scapular, as part of the habit, is common to many religious Orders, but it is a special feature of the Carmelites. A smaller form of the scapular is given to lay persons in order that they may share in the great graces associated with it. Such a grace is the "Sabbatine privilege." In the so-called Bulla Sabbatina, John XXII affirmed that wearers of the scapular are soon freed from the flames of purgatory, at least by the Saturday after death. The latest confirmation of the Bulla Sabbatina was promulgated by the Sacred Congregation of Indulgences on July 4, 1908. The Blessed Virgin's scapular should remind us that Christians have an apostolate against current extremes and extravagances in modes of dress. Clothes are a symbol of the person. Like the Christian heart, dress must be chaste and simple, for one judges the interior from the exterior. It should not be necessary to add that special attention be given this matter when preparing for church attendance." ~ Rev. Pius Parsch

Today, a midsummer Deliverance Mass. Father Lawrence Smith, formerly of OLHC, and now living in the hinterlands of the mid-west will offer the fifth of a novena of Masses today. Father Smith: "Holy Mother Church has recourse to novenas in order to obtain that which men on earth might otherwise despair of receiving. I will celebrate a Novena of Masses over the next nine months, culminating with a series of nine Masses beginning on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception: She, who trod on the head of the infernal serpent at the first instance of Her creation, and who continues to crush the powers of hell until the end of time. The intention of the Masses is for the deliverance of our loved ones (and ourselves) from the influence, assaults and tyranny of satan and his demons." To participate most fully, ATTEND MASS or make a Spiritual Communion on these days; INCLUDE THESE INTENTIONS as part of your daily Rosary for the next nine months; and, PRAY THE NOVENA to the Immaculate Conception from November 29 through December 7. All parishioners of Our Lady Help of Christians have been enrolled generally.
