Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be November 3rd. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Pope Pius XI, in instituting the feast of the KINGSHIP OF CHRIST, desired to make solemn proclamation of the social dominion of our Lord Jesus Christ over the world. Christ, the King of souls and consciences, of intellects and wills, is also the King of families and cities, peoples and nations. He is King of the whole universe. As Pius XI showed in his Encyclical, Quas Primas, of December 11, 1925, secularism is the direct denial of this Kingship of Christ; by organizing social life as if God did not exist, it leads to the apostasy of the masses and the ruin of society. The whole of today's Mass and Office are a solemn assertion of the universal royalty of Christ against the great heresy of our days which is secularism. Occurring as it does on the last Sunday of October, towards the end of the liturgical year and just before the feast of All Saints, the feast of the Kingship of Christ appears as the crowning glory of all the mysteries of the life of Christ and as an anticipation in time, of the eternal royalty which He exercises over all the elect in the glory of heaven. DELIVERANCE MASSES! Today being the Feast of Christ the King, it is also the occurrence of the eighth of a novena of Masses offered by Father Lawrence Smith of Pleasant Prairie, WI, with the intention of the deliverance of our loved ones (and/or ourselves) from the influence, assaults, and tyranny of Satan and his demons. To most fully participate, attend Mass or make a Spiritual Communion; include said intentions as part of your daily Rosary; and pray the Novena to the Immaculate Conception: November 29 through December 7. All OLHC parishioners have been generically enrolled.

THE FEAST OF ALL SAINTS is this coming Friday, November 1st; it is a Holyday of Obligation. Masses at OLHC will be at 7:00AM in the morning and 7:00PM in the evening. The following day, Saturday, is All Souls Day; it is NOT a Holyday. Masses here will be consecutively at 7:00, 8:00 and 9:00 in the morning.
