Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, which is today. The next blessing will be December 1st. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

PRAYER FOR THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA - on the eve of the election

Almighty and Eternal God, King of Kings and Lord of Lords, graciously turn your gaze to us who invoke you with confidence. Bless us, citizens of the United States of America, grant peace and prosperity to our Nation; illumine those who govern us so that they may commit themselves to the common good, in respect for Your Holy Law. Protect those who, defending the inviolable principles of the Natural Law and Your Commandments, must face the repeated assaults of the enemy of the human race. Keep in the hearts of your children, courage for the truth, love for virtue and perseverance in the midst of trials. Make our families grow in the example that Our Lord has given us, together with His Most Holy Mother and Saint Joseph in the home of Nazareth; give to our fathers and mothers the gift of strength, to educate wisely the children with which you have blessed them. Give courage to those who, in spiritual combat, fight the good fight as soldiers of Christ against the furious forces of the children of darkness, keep each one of us, O Lord, in Your Most Sacred Heart, and above all he, whom Your Providence has placed at the head of our Nation. Bless the President of the United States of America, so that aware of his responsibility and his duties, he may be a knight of justice, a defender of the oppressed, a firm bulwark against your enemies, and a proud supporter of the children of light. Place the United States of America and the whole world under the mantle of the Queen of Victories, Our Unconquered Leader in battle, the Immaculate Conception. It is thanks to her and through Your mercy, that the hymn of praise rises to You, O Lord, from the children whom You have redeemed in the Most Precious Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen. (With the approval of Monsignor Patrick J. Perez)

We are approaching the third anniversary of the death of Monsignor Perez, November 18th. To honor him, indeed, to pray for the repose of his soul, we are planning a public Rosary, that is to say, everyone is invited to attend. It will be at his gravesite at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery in Orange; 7845 Santiago Canyon Road on Sunday, November 17th, beginning at 12:30PM. We hope to have a big turnout of his friends and spiritual family. Please come join us if you can!

THE FAITHFUL, as often as they visit a church or public oratory, in order to pray for the dead on the day on which the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed is celebrated, or on the Sunday immediately following [TODAY!], may gain: A plenary indulgence only for souls detained in purgatory, on the condition of confession and Communion, and the recitation six times per visit of Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be, for the intentions of the Sovereign Pontiff. (Holy Office: 1914, 1916, 1930, 1939)

THE FAITHFUL who during the period of eight days from the Commemoration of All Souls inclusive, visit a cemetery in a spirit of piety and devotion, and pray, even mentally, for the dead, may gain: A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, on each day of the Octave, applicable only to the dead.
