Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be February 2nd. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

New Years used to come in with a BANG!!! Nowadays it just sneaks in the back door and leaves a "to-do" list a mile long on the table. Here are a few things of importance you might need to add to that to-do list while there's still some room. The Sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred by a bishop of the SSPX sometime in earliest March. The exact date and place are yet unknown due his episcopal schedule. That is to say, it may need to take place exclusively in Arcadia. If you have an unconfirmed child, here are the ground rules: Your child should be at the very least, 9 years of age (but maturity can play a part); he should of course have been baptized and made his First Communion as well. While we trust our parish parents impeccably, it is necessary that they produce sacramental certificates of Baptism and First Communion for the child before the March Confirmations. There will be sign-up sheets in the giftshop for the next few weeks, as well as other vital information. Please help yourself. Finally, all the confirmands will need to pass a test which will be administered here in February.

The next to-do item is First Communion which will occur on the Second Sunday after Easter, May 4th. The child must be of 7 years, have a copy of his Baptismal Certificate, and, if he is not already in our Sunday class, have his name on the sign-up in the giftshop. Prospective First Communicants will be tested toward the end of March and make their First Confession on either April 4 or 11, the date is not yet firm! You will also want to email the Academy (see above) if your child needs one of these sacraments.

Let's take things a step further; if your child is a young adult, not having received First Communion or Confirmation, now is the time to do it. Likewise, if you yourself are a baptized adult finding yourself in a similar situation, now is the time! If you are not baptized but wish to be, call the Sacramental Planning number on the first page, or speak with Father after Mass. There's no time like the present!
