Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be February 2nd. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

With tremendous gratitude to all who contributed to the "Fourth Annual Adopt-A-Family in Brazil for Christmas" drive begun by the late Msgr. Patrick Perez, we happily announce that the total number of Christmas Baskets (which included a whole cooked chicken for Christmas) came to more than 300 Baskets, feeding hundreds of poor Catholic families. This is a tremendous Christmas miracle, especially since the strength of the U. S. Dollar suddenly increased, thus obtaining more food in each Basket than was originally expected.

The Director of St. Philomena Center (63) in Barbalha Ceara, Brazil, said that he specifically targeted the poorest areas to bring these Baskets of your Christmas Cheer. Several volunteers were engaged over a three day period to help with obtaining bulk food items and assembling the Baskets before physically delivering them to the families on Christmas Eve. These volunteers were thrilled to help their neighbors. Most families had very little food and certainly nothing special to enjoy on Christmas. To these families, Christmas is "just another day." Your generosity gave them a special Joy - the joy of not only a good meal but also of knowing that there are people who care about them. It doesn't get more heartwarming than that.

This is a miracle through St. Philomena, and the Blessings given to poor, hungry souls in another country will also redound to bless you, due to your almsgiving. The soul of Msgr. Perez also benefits from many graces due to his efforts in initiating this ongoing Work of Mercy. Many donors gave in his honor, which is a great testament to his memory. The Sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred during the first week of March, the date is undecided. The ceremony will take place in Arcadia; there is a chance it will occur here as well. If your child will be Confirmed, you must have his Baptismal and First Communion certificates, which are obtained from the parish where they were received. There is a sign-up sheet on the giftshop counter as well as a Confirmation Registration Form and a Practical Details sheet which contain much valuable information. Of equal importance is a four-page Minimum Knowledge pack. It is not an exaggeration to say your child should have this committed to memory before the ceremony. Please help yourself.

First Communion will take place in this Chapel on the 4th of May, for which the child's Baptismal Certificate is also required. Please see the signup sheet in the giftshop for other information.
