Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be February 2nd. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Padre Pio Academy will observe **Michael Soto Day** this Thursday, January 30. There will be a Requiem Mass that day at 8:15AM for the repose of his soul. All are welcome to attend. Mass will be followed by a light breakfast for the students, then a caravan to Holy Sepulcher Cemetery, there to visit Michael's grave, also that of Monsignor Perez and others who are near and dear to us: reciting a decade of the Rosary at each. Upon returning, everyone will enjoy their lunch, THEN junior and senior high school will go bowling while the younger students stay at school to enjoy Wheel Day, riding their bikes, scooters, roller skates, and popping wheelies with their remote control cars. This day is spent, among the more obvious reasons, as an opportunity to teach our young students that there is death; and as well, that there is also life after death. Michael was an altarboy for Father Fred Schell for many years and a graduate of Padre Pio Academy. He was called forth from this life on January 30, 2001, the first of our graduates, so far as we know, to see their Blessed Savior. May he rest in peace.

Next Sunday, February 2nd, is the **Feast of the Purification of Our Blessed Mother**, marking forty days since the birth of Our Savior. Thus, the Feast does not fall routinely on Sunday but when it does, it takes precedence over the Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany. Also known as Candlemas Day, it is the occasion of one of the three great blessings of the year, that of candles; the others being ashes and palms. The blessing of candles will take place promptly at 10:00, followed by a procession. To heighten the occasion, the Mass of the Purification will be a High Mass. If anyone would like to bring candles to be blessed, you are welcome to do so; they should be clearly marked with your name and must be brought in BEFORE 9:30AM!!!
