<u>Modesty in Church</u> Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

<u>Communion Fast</u> Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

<u>Confession Procedure</u> Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Mass Requests</u> \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

<u>Chapel Etiquette</u> Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

<u>OLHC</u> is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing will be January 5th. Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

"The shepherds set out without delay; they wait not for the daylight (they put aside all considerations for the safety of their flock;) they loiter not by the way, but press forward with hasty steps until they come to Bethlehem. Would you find God? Then you must seek Him with zeal. 'Thou seest the haste of the shepherds,' says St. Ambrose. 'He who would find Jesus must not be indolent in seeking Him.' Examine how you have hitherto sought for Jesus. How slow and lukewarm have you been in His service! How often have you allowed even inconsiderable hindrances to keep you back from duties and exercises of piety! How often has it happened that for a time you were zealous in God's service, and then relapsed into your former lukewarmness. Consider how necessary amendment is, and reflect in what particular greater and more persevering zeal is required.

The shepherds did not arrive at perfect knowledge by the word of the Angel, but when they found all according to his word, they were fully persuaded that the Infant in the manger was the Savior of the world. They saw and understood. Virtue is learned by experience alone. When you read a spiritual book, listen to Christian instruction, or meditate, God speaks to you; that is the beginning of holy knowledge. Carry out in practice what you have read, heard, or meditated upon; then you really make the truths of salvation your own. You have hitherto made but small progress in this knowledge, because you have practiced so little what you have been taught. Follow the example of the Saints, who, by diligently exercising themselves in virtue, obtained a deeper insight into religious truth, than learned men could acquire by years of study." ~Nicholas Avancinus S.J.
