Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

<u>Confession Procedure</u> Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Mass Requests</u> \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

<u>Chapel Etiquette</u> Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

<u>OLHC</u> is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, which is today. The next blessing will be May 4th Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Today is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week: which schedule and details thereof you will find below. Please save this bulletin for reference!

Palm Sunday Masses:

7:30AM Mass is preceded by confessions. The Palms will NOT be blessed at this Mass; thus they will not be available until the 10:00 Mass.

10:00AM Mass is preceded by confessions. The service begins with the Blessing of the Palms and distribution to the congregation at the altar rail. Men process first to the altar rail as though receiving Holy Communion. In receiving the Palm, the faithful should first kiss the Palm then the priest's hand, lastly, returning to your pew. The priest will then lead the choir and congregation in a procession around the property with Palms in hand, finally returning to the Chapel where you may take your seat as Mass will begin momentarily. Any remaining Blessed Palms will be left in the giftshop for pickup during the course of the week.

Wednesday, April 16, 8:00AM Low Mass. Preceded by confession. Maundy Thursday, April 17, Confession begins at 6:00PM.

7:00PM, The Mass of the Lord's Supper. The "Mandatum" or washing of the feet, will take place after the Gospel is read. ***Please Note: ***We are in need of twelve adult volunteer gentlemen that this ceremony may take place. Please find a sign-up sheet on the giftshop counter today.*** Mass completed, the priest ceremoniously under canopy, transfers the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose in Father Schell Hall, as the choir intones the Pange Lingua. Follows, the stripping of the altar and the ceremony is concluded.

The Blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose is available for Adoration until midnight.

Good Friday, April 18, Confession begins at noon: 12:00PM.

Stations of the Cross begin at 1:00PM.

Veneration of the Cross begins at 2:00PM followed by the Mass of the Pre-Sanctified.

Holy Saturday, April 19, (Midnight Mass) Confession begins at 9:30PM.

10:30PM, Ceremonies begin with the Blessing Holy Water and of the New Fire with a candlelit procession. Candles will be available on a table outside the Chapel. 11:45PM, Midnight Mass begins - the first Mass of Easter Day. (This Mass fulfills your Sunday obligation.) Easter Lauds will be chanted immediately following Mass. The Holy Water blessed before this Mass will be available, but please, only one, 16oz bottle per family!

Easter Sunday, April 20, Two Masses only: 7:30AM and 10:00AM, each preceded by confession. There will be no choir at the 10:00 Mass.

The little ones are sure to enjoy our **Annual Easter Egg Hunt** immediately following the 7:30AM Easter Mass. They must have their own baskets in hand!
