<u>Modesty in Church</u> Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

<u>Communion Fast</u> Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

<u>Confession Procedure</u> Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Mass Requests</u> \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

Chapel Availability Update! Beginning tomorrow, the Chapel will be closed 48 hours for carpet cleaning; that is, Monday, April 7 and Tuesday, April 8. During this timeframe you will be unable to enter for any private devotions whatsoever! Wednesday morning the Chapel will resume the normal hours of operation with Holy Mass celebrated at 8:00AM. It will be uplifting to see everything clean and spotless as we enter into Holy Week. This would be a good time for a gentle general reminder that food and drink are never permitted in the Chapel. If you've brought a lunch, please feel free to enjoy it outside under the sprawling shade tree.

"Today if you shall hear the voice of the Lord, harden not your hearts." Holy Church begins the night Office of Passion Sunday with these words of the psalm and repeats them on every feria between this and Maundy Thursday. Everything around us urges us to mourn. The images of the saints, the very crucifix on our altar, are veiled from our sight. The Church is oppressed with grief. During the first four weeks of Lent, she compassionated her Jesus fasting in the desert; His coming sufferings and crucifixion and death are what now fill her with anguish. ~The Liturgical Year

Today, Passion Sunday, occurs the second of a series of a Novena of Masses offered by Father Lawrence Smith in Wisconsin for the deliverance of our loved ones and ourselves from the influence, assaults and tyranny of Satan and his demons. If you would more fully join with Father in this endeavor, attend Mass today or make a Spiritual Communion; keep the intention in your daily Rosary for the next nine months and pray the Novena to the Immaculate Conception beginning November 29th.

This coming Sunday is Palm Sunday, Dominica in Palmis; the beginning of Holy Week. The Masses will be: 7:30AM and 10:00AM. The Blessing of Palms, their distribution and the procession around the grounds will occur at the 10:00 Mass. Thus there will be no Blessed Palms available at the 7:30 Mass. Any extra Palms will be available during the course of the week. The Holy Week schedule is the same as last year - it will be published here next Sunday for your convenience. On Holy Thursday evening during the course of the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we will have the ceremony of the washing of the feet, also called the Mandatum from the first word of the antiphon. After the gospel of the Mass, the celebrant girds himself with a towel and kneeling down, washes the feet of those who have been chosen. We are in need of twelve adult gentleman volunteers that this ceremony may take place. Please find a sign-up sheet on the gift shop counter today and next Sunday.

Mass Remembrance cards for Easter are available in the giftshop; \$5 per recipient. Please be aware, although the Mass cards indicate they are for a "novena" of Masses, they are actually for an "octave" of Masses, that is eight instead of nine. We apologize for the error!
