<u>Modesty in Church</u> Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

<u>Communion Fast</u> Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

<u>Confession Procedure</u> Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Mass Requests</u> \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

The faithful who receive Holy Communion for the first time or who are present at the First Communion of others, are granted a plenary indulgence on the usual conditions (July 12, 1905). O Jesus, who hast loved us with such exceeding great love as to give us the ineffable gift of the Holy Eucharist, inflame us with a burning zeal to promote Thy glory by preparing worthily the little children who are to approach Thy holy table for the first time. Protect, O Sacred Heart of Jesus, these young souls from the assaults of evil, strengthen their faith, increase their love and endow them with all the virtues that will make them worthy to receive Thee. In mid-April, our students sat for their annual achievement test, the **Stanford University Test Series**, regarded to be the more difficult of this variety of examination. The tests were taken at the eighth academic month of each grade, e.g. first grade would be 1.8, etc. These are followed by their respective "grade equivalency", that is, their actual level of academic achievement. Here are the results:

These results are the average of all students in those grades based on their test scores in all subjects. This is not "artificial intelligence" folks, this is the real thing! Considering some students were at a remedial level upon entering PPA, we feel the results are reflective of the quality of education we provide. Compare these results to a national study showing California's 4th and 8th grader reading skills have plummeted, remaining lower than the 2017 scores. The same applies to their math and English scores (and this, incidentally, even on a national level).

If you are the parents of school-age children, it is obvious that Padre Pio Academy is where they should be, particularly if you desire to instill in their minds true and traditional Catholic values.
