**Modesty in Church** Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

**Communion Fast** Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

**Confession Procedure** Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

**Mass Requests** \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

**Chapel Etiquette** Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

**OLHC** is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

**No unapproved literature** may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

**Need something blessed?** The first Sunday of each month after each Mass, which is today! Please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

**Lost and Found** Please remember to identify your Missals and prayer books for a safe return. If you have lost something, check the lost and found bin in the bookstore or table outside on Sundays and if you find something left in the pews, please return it to the bin to find its rightful owner.

### **THE FRUITS OF THE ASCENSION OF CHRIST**

"Lift up your gates, O ye Princes, and be ye lifted up, O eternal gates!" Psalm xxiii  
The first fruit of Christ's Ascension, is the re-opening of the gates of Heaven, which had been closed against us by reason of sin; so that we may now, if we will, enter into eternal glory. How must our forefathers have sighed and lamented in Limbo, when Heaven was so long closed against them! With what jubilant rejoicing they must have beheld the re-opening of the gates of Heaven! With joy unspeakable should you exult that Heaven, with its everlasting bliss, is open also to you. Reflect, however on the dreadful evil of sin, which for four thousand years, closed Heaven against mankind; and even now excludes all who are defiled thereby. Abhor sin above all things, and shun it more than death; that when you knock at the gates of Heaven, you may not hear those dreadful words— "The door is shut."  
**"I go to prepare a place for you."**

The second fruit of the Ascension of Christ, is that He prepares a place for us. Not only His Passion and Death, but His Resurrection and Ascension are works which He accomplished out of love for us. By His sufferings and death He redeemed us from sin and everlasting death; by His Resurrection and Ascension He obtained for us grace, by which we also might rise in glory and enter into Heaven. Where He, our Head is, there shall we His members be. Thus all that Jesus did was for our sakes; and He has become our very own. Should you not also do all for His sake, and give yourself wholly to Him? Would that you could be persuaded once for all, to die to self and the world, and to live only to Jesus!

**"We have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ, the just."**

The third fruit of the Ascension of Jesus, is His advocacy with the Father. We have sinned repeatedly and grievously, and have relapsed into the same sins; yet need we not despair of salvation; for in Jesus we have an Advocate, Who intercedes for us with the Heavenly Father, ever showing His wounds to reconcile Him to us, and to procure for us His grace. Often reflect on the love and solicitude, with which, even in Heaven, Jesus espouses your cause; thank Him from the bottom of your heart, and love Him above all! Consider that Jesus, as He Himself affirms, "prays not for the world." Live not, then, according to the maxims of the world, but according to the spirit of Jesus Christ; that you may not be excluded from the benefits of His most gracious prayers. Should you sometimes be tempted to live after the usual fashion of the world, say to yourself, "The world passeth away and the concupiscence thereof." ~ Nicholas Avancinus, S.J.
