Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing is July 6th, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Sunday within the Octave of Corpus Christi: The Eucharist and supernatural joy Christ gives Himself to us as the nourishment of our souls: "My flesh is meat indeed, and My blood is drink indeed." And it is in the midst of a repast, under the form of food, that Our Lord chose to institute it. This bread from heaven gives us life by nourishing grace within us. It has in it all that is delicious and sweet. Nothing is so joyous as a feast; Holy Communion is the feast of the soul, that is to say, a source of deeper joys.

See Him in the supper room after He has instituted this Divine Sacrament. He speaks to His Apostles of His joy; He desires that this joy, His own joy, altogether divine, should become ours, and that our hearts should be filled with it: Ut gaudium meum in vobis sit. It is one of the effects of the Eucharist when received with devotion, to fill the soul with supernatural sweetness that renders it prompt and devoted in God's service. Let us not forget however, that this joy is, above all, spiritual, the Eucharist being eminently the "mystery of faith." Christ, ever living, acts in silence, but sovereignly in the innermost depths of the soul in order to transform it into Himself.

There is no action wherein our faith can be exercised with greater intensity than in Communion; to believe in Christ, Whose Divinity and Humanity are both hidden under the appearances of the Host. When Christ Jesus, in showing us a little bread and wine, tells us: "This is My Body. This is My Blood," and our intelligence, putting aside all that the senses say, accepts these words of Christ; when our will leads us in faith and love to the Holy Table, then we accomplish the highest and most absolute act of faith that can be.

Eucharistic Communion is the most perfect act of our Divine adoption. There is no moment when we are more justly entitled to say to our Father in heaven: "O heavenly Father, I abide in Thy Son Jesus, and He abides in me. I have received Thy Son with faith; faith tells me that at this moment I am with Him, and since I share His life, behold me *in* Him, *through* Him, *with* Him as the Son in Whom Thou art well pleased." ~ Dom Columba Marmion
