June 8, 2025 Pentecost <u>Modesty in Church</u> Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

<u>Communion Fast</u> Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

<u>Confession Procedure</u> Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Mass Requests</u> \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

<u>Chapel Etiquette</u> Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

<u>OLHC</u> is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded. **Need something blessed?** The first Sunday of each month after each Mass. The next blessing is July 6th, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Besides the image of grace which Christ places in the soul, He confers on it His strength and vigor through which He works in the soul and gives it movement, so that instead of resting, it is like a fire which sends its flames toward the heavens.

Christ not only communicates His power and movement to us, but He sends the Holy Ghost to the souls of the just. Not only is Christ united with us through grace, virtue, and good works, but the Holy Ghost Himself is present in souls, dwelling there in a sweet and blessed manner. As the Holy Ghost proceeds from the Father and the Son as a result of their sweet and intimate bond of love, and is, indeed, substantial Love, so He is in the Church and in all the souls of the just to quicken and inflame them and unite them to Himself in love. "If anyone love me," said Christ, "he will keep my word, and My Father will love him, and We will come to him, and will make Our abode with him." And St. Paul says: "Because the charity of God is poured forth in our hearts by the Holy Ghost, who is given unto us." Again, "Know you not that you are the temples of God and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?"

Christ's action in the body is likewise remarkable, for He unites it to His own. Not only did He assume our flesh in the nature of His humanity and unite it to His divine Person in a bond so close that it will never be broken, a union which is an indissoluble marriage consummated between humanity and the eternal Word, (according to St. Augustine, in the bridal chamber of the most pure womb of the Immaculate Virgin), but He unites His body with the body of His Church and all its members who worthily receive Him in the Sacrament of the altar. Christ made explicit reference to this union of His body with ours when He said: "Except you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink His blood, you shall not have life in you. He that eateth My flesh and drinketh My blood hath everlasting life, and I will raise him up in the last day. . . He that eateth My flesh and drinketh My blood abideth in Me and I in him."

And St. Paul says: "For we, being many, are one bread, one body, all that partake of one bread." From this we may conclude that Christ the Bridegroom, and the Church, His beloved Bride, are one body when the faithful worthily receive Him in the Host. For it is true that when Mass is celebrated and one receives Communion, we touch the body of our Spouse and we kiss and embrace Him and are joined to Him as to our Bridegroom. ~Fray Luis de Leon, O.S.A. (1527-1591)
