July 13, 2025 Fifth Sunday after Pentecost St. Anacletus, PM <u>Modesty in Church</u> Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

<u>Confession Procedure</u> Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Mass Requests</u> \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

<u>Chapel Etiquette</u> Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

<u>OLHC</u> is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

DISPOSITIONS FOR COMMUNION Consider the three principal dispositions which we ought to bring to Holy Communion: a humility full of respect; a love full of confidence; and a great desire to unite ourselves to Our Lord. Resolve to form within ourselves these holy dispositions before and during Holy Communion and to preserve and perfect them every day in our souls. Let us adore the immense goodness of the Son of God giving himself to us in Holy Communion. His infinite love is communicated to us therein without reserve: His Body, His Blood, His soul, His grace His divinity - He gives all!

A Humility Full of Reverence ~ This feeling ought to spring up within us from meditation on this double thought, Who art Thou O Lord, and who am I? Thou so great, the Sovereign of the universe, the God of eternity, and I such a little, miserable creature; I, a worm of the earth; Thou, so holy before Whom the heavens are not pure, and I so evil, who have soiled my past life by so many sins, who still sin daily, and should sin yet more if Thy grace did not prevent me. Ah, Lord, I am seized with reverence and confusion in Thy presence: with reverence, while considering Thy lofty majesty and infinite holiness; with confusion while considering myself, and it only remains for me to say with the centurion of the gospel, "Lord, I am not worthy that Thou shouldst enter under my roof." Alas Lord, when I think that in Thy presence the pillars of heaven tremble, and that the highest seraphim dare not look upon Thy lofty majesty, ought I not to be confounded and overwhelmed with a feeling of reverence and of humility?

A Love Full of Confidence ~ Love, says St. Bernard, cannot rest satisfied unless it is reciprocated. Now, the Eucharist is the greatest sacrament of love. It is therein that the love of Our Lord displays all its riches and expends itself wholly for men. It is therein that He gives Himself to us without reserve, without limit: body, blood, soul and divinity, He gives all. We must therefore in return give to Him an undivided love, a love which gives itself wholly up to Him, a love which delivers itself up with an absolute abandonment to all which He desires of us: a love which cares for nothing else than Him, which takes pleasure only in Him, so as to be able to say with St. Bonaventure: "The Lord is my only love; may nothing else please me, nothing have any charm or attraction for me, save Him alone! He is everything for me; may I then be everything for Him, and may my heart become one with Him."

Holy Desires ~ This Heavenly Bread ought to be eaten with great hunger; it produces its fruits in the soul in proportion to the desire with which it is received. We ought then to desire Holy Communion with our whole soul; desire it as being the greatest happiness of our life. As the infant desires its mother's breast. Let us here examine ourselves. Do we bring to Holy Communion these three dispositions of our meditation: humility, love and holy desires?
