Modesty in Church Out of respect for our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month after each Mass which is today. The next blessing is August 3rd, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

~Preparing ourselves for Holy Communion ~ First of all we must cleanse our souls of everything that might wound the holy eyes of God. There are two things which wound them. First, sin: mortal sin which God holds in horror; also venial sin which is to the soul, in the presence of God, as spots and ulcers are on the face. Second, attachment to creatures, because attachments divide the heart, and are on that account, displeasing to the heavenly Spouse, who desires to have the whole heart. Secondly in preparation, on days which precede Holy Communion, we must be wholly occupied with this great thought: "I am preparing myself to communicate" and consequently we must perform all our actions in a holy manner, in a spirit of preparation, and multiply holy aspirations toward Jesus Christ, often asking ourselves, Who is He who is about to come to me? It is the Lord. Who am I, that am going to receive him? O Lord, I am not worthy. What is He going to do with me? He desires to make of me a saint. What is it that procures for me so great a happiness? Is it His pure love; it is, on His side, gratuitous goodness. I do not in the least deserve it. Lastly, during the day we must often have a great desire to receive Our Lord, and if we do not feel it, we must at any rate have a lively wish to experience it, and offer in place of it, the dispositions of the Blessed Virgin and of all the saints. Thirdly, on the eve of Holy Communion we must be more recollected, more separated from the world, less occupied with worldly affairs; we should leave less liberty to the senses, above all to the eyes, like the Saint of whom St. Jerome says: "His eyes desired in so lively a manner to behold Jesus Christ that they did not deign to look at anything else." At night we must go to sleep with the thought of the communion to be made the next day, return to it during the night when we awake, and at our rising in the morning; until the moment when we approach the Holy Table we must persevere in prayer and in holy desires. Is it thus that we act? ~ Father M. Hamon, S.S. (Imp: 1904)
