Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests No Mass Requests are being accepted until the current requests have been assigned.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month. The next blessing is September 7th, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Friday is the Feast of the Assumption, a Holyday of Obligation. When the dogma, proper to the mystery of the Assumption was solemnly defined in 1950, a new Mass formulary was promulgated that puts into even greater relief Mary's incomparable dignity and privileges. A cosmic picture from the Apocalypse is flashed before us at the Introit: "A great sign appeared in the heavens, a Woman clothed with the sun, and the moon beneath Her feet, and upon Her head a crown of twelve stars." Could there be a more sublime and inspiring representation of heaven's Queen than this, aglow with the radiance of the celestial orbs?

Mary was the first who shared her Son's glorification in fullest measure, body too; surely then, we do have ample reason for breaking forth in a "new canticle." In the liturgy the word "new" has a most singular connotation, in that it refers to the supernatural - the life of grace here on earth, and hereafter the "new heaven and the new earth." Our "new canticle" is sung in praise of the bodily exaltation of God's Mother, the mirabilia divinely wrought in her favor: the first glorified member of the human race who entered the courts of heaven.

Thereby "the Lord made known His salvation and revealed His righteousness to all the world." By faith "all the ends of the earth see the salvation wrought by our God." Thereupon paeans of praise ascend in Mary's honor from all creation. For all creation sees in her the first fruits of its own final transfiguration into glory: "Sing praise to the Lord upon the zither; the sea must roar and all that it fills, the whole earth and its inhabitants. The rivers must clap their hands, the hills sing together for joy." Could there be a more magnificent overture to the Mass drama? ~ Pius Parsch: Year of Grace
