Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests For the living, dead or special intentions- \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month, which is today. The next blessing will be December 7th, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

We wish everyone a blessed and holy Month of the Holy Souls as your departed loved ones are commemorated at each Mass offered on this Altar. Today is observed the Twenty-First Sunday after Pentecost, which delays the feast of All Holy Souls until tomorrow, when there will be three consecutive morning Masses: 7:00, 7:30 and 8:15AM. As a reminder then, if you haven't submitted a Souls Mass Remembrance envelope, they are available on the giftshop counter. You may enclose even an extensive list of those you wish remembered, including a minimum stipend of \$10. Drop the envelope into either the collection or the Mass request mailbox on the wall in the giftshop.

In a similar manner, our spiritual friend, Father Lawrence Smith of Wisconsin, will celebrate on All Souls Day, the ninth of an Octave of Masses (scattered across the year,) with the specific intention of the deliverance of our loved ones and ourselves, from the influence, assaults and tyranny of satan and his demons. To fully participate, Father asks that you attend Mass or make a Spiritual Communion, including the intention in your daily Rosary, and pray the Novena to the Immaculate Conception from November 29 through December 7. The Novena concludes with an additional series of nine consecutive Masses beginning on the feast of the Immaculate Conception, December 8. All parishioners of OLHC have been so enrolled.

As is our annual habit of spiritual pilgrimage, after morning Mass tomorrow, the Padre Pio Academy students embark via caravan, to Good Shepherd Cemetery in Huntington Beach, there to pray the Holy Rosary at the graves of a number of friends and benefactors; first among them, Father Frederick Schell. May they rest in peace.
