<u>Modesty in Church</u> Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

<u>Communion Fast</u> Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

<u>Confession Procedure</u> Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

<u>Mass Requests</u> For the living, dead or special intentions- \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

<u>Chapel Etiquette</u> Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

<u>OLHC</u> is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded. **Need something blessed?** The first Sunday of each month. The next blessing will be next Sunday December 7th, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Today being November 30th, would be the Feast of Saint Andrew, except it is transferred to tomorrow since the First Sunday of Advent takes precedence. Nonetheless, today begins the "Saint Andrew Christmas Novena" a short prayer recited fifteen times daily until Christmas Day. It is piously believed that whoever recites the prayer will obtain the favor requested:

"Hail and blessed be the Hour and Moment in which the Son of God was born of the Most Pure Virgin Mary, at Midnight in Bethlehem in piercing cold. In that Hour, vouchsafe O My God, to hear my prayers and grant my petitions through the merits of Our Savior, Jesus Christ, and of His Most Holy Mother. Amen.

"That which was effected at Christ's birth was altogether unique: it was the birth of the God-man. The three Persons are one in the same divine nature, and yet all three Persons were not made man, but only the Son, who became man in such wise that He did not cease to be God nor did His divine nature blend with His human nature. Rather, He was the same Person but had two distinct natures, one divine and the other human. Moreover, the God-man was not fashioned from clay as was the first man. He was formed of the immaculate blood of the most pure Virgin, without stain or injury to her purity and virginity. The Son of God in His human nature was of the lineage of Adam, but He did not incur the sin of Adam. His flesh was formed from her blood and this flesh was fashioned into a human body with all its members and organs.
