Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests For the living, dead or special intentions- \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month. The next blessing will be February 1st, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Sunday within the Octave of the Epiphany; Feast of the Holy Family

The obedience of Jesus during His hidden life [from Dom Columba Marmion]

You have read how all that the Evangelists tell us of Christ's hidden life at Nazareth, with Mary and Joseph, is that "He was subject to them" and "advanced in wisdom and age." Is there anything incompatible with His Divinity in this? Certainly not. The Word is made Flesh, He has stooped so far as to take a nature like ours, sin excepted: He came, said He, "not to be ministered unto, but to minister"; to be "obedient unto death"; that is why He willed to obey His Mother. At Nazareth, He obeyed Mary and Joseph, the two privileged beings whom God had placed near Him. In a certain measure, Mary shares in the authority of the Eternal Father over His Son's Humanity. Jesus could say of His Mother what he said of His Father in Heaven: *Quae placita sunt ei facio semper*. "I do always the things that please her." from: *Christ the Life of the Soul*

"How is it that you sought me? Did you not know, that I must be about my Father's business?" These are the first words fallen from the lips of the Incarnate Word that have been gathered up by the Gospel. They epitomize the whole Person and work of Jesus; they tell of His Divine Sonship and indicate His supernatural mission. All Christ's existence will be but a striking and magnificent commentary on these words. St. Luke, who had doubtless gathered the humble avowal from the Virgin herself, tells us that, "they understood not the word that He had spoken unto them."

Out of a life of thirty-three years, He Who is Eternal Wisdom chose to pass thirty of these years in silence and obscurity, submission and labor.
