Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests For the living, dead or special intentions- \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month. The next blessing will be April 5th, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Today, the fifth Sunday in Lent is Passion Sunday, taking the name from its being the day on which Holy Church begins Her solemn and mournful commemoration of our Lord's Passion. Henceforth, the Preface of the Holy Cross is said at daily Mass; the Psalm *Judica me Deus* and the *Gloria Patri* are omitted as in the Masses of the Dead. Very striking is the veiling in churches of all the crosses, statues, and sacred pictures in allusion to the words: "Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple." ~ The Roman Missal for the Laity. 1948 ~

Next Sunday is ***Dominica in Palmis***, that is, Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. The Masses here are the usual, 7:30 and 10:00 AM. The 7:30 will be a low Mass with no distribution of palms as they will not be blessed until the 10:00 Mass which will be a solemn Mass with choir, blessing and distribution of palms and procession around the grounds. The palms remaining will be available for pick up throughout the week and next Sunday.

Father Lawrence Smith, formerly of OLHC, will begin his annual **Novena of Deliverance Masses** starting next week with Palm Sunday, and the second on Resurrection Sunday, each with the intention of the deliverance of our loved ones/ourselves from the influence, assaults and tyranny of Satan and his demons. To partake of these graces, attend Mass or make a spiritual communion on these days, include these intentions as part of your daily Rosary for the next nine months and pray the Novena to the Immaculate Conception from November 29 through December 7. All OLHC parishioners have been enrolled as a group.

We are certainly indebted to Father Alphonsus for having found time in his busy schedule to spend a valuable three days with us, delivering a Lenten Mission. Thank you Father, may our Lady of Perpetual Help bless and keep you always! Also, a big *Thank You!!!* to Mr. Chris Condon for his dedication and technical expertise in making this Mission available to the on-line multitudes. What a blessing!
