Modesty in Church Out of respect for our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests For the living, dead or special intentions- \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month. The next blessing will be May 3rd, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Another French Connection at Our Lady Help of Christians

The village of Paray-le-Monial is a colorful garden spot situated as it is upon the banks of the Bourbince, a sub-tributary of the Loire. It had from earliest times found itself spiritually well-endowed due to its proximity to the great abbey of Cluny. Within this village, in the non-descript chapel of the Visitation Convent, appeared our Lord to Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque, in the late 17th century, revealing for the first time the mystery of His Heart to her: "My Heart is so full of love for men, that the flames of its ardent love can no longer be contained, but must be poured out through you." Soon thereafter, He revealed to her His Sacred Heart saying, "behold this Heart which has so loved men." His pleas to her ultimately resulted in the institution of the Feast of the Sacred Heart as well as the First Friday devotion. Interestingly, her confessor and spiritual director was St. Claude de Columbiere SJ, himself also a devotee of the Sacred Heart. St. Margaret Mary's incorrupt heart may be venerated even today in that same Chapel of the Apparitions. Inscribed in French above the exterior chapel door is this modest memorial: "In this church Our Lord revealed His Heart to Ste. Marguerite Marie." Slightly above our own altar, in one of the four antique French reliquaries, abides a relic of the first class, a tiniest particle of the person of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647 - 1690). This is certainly a great treasure to have in our midst. "The thoughts of His Heart extend to all generations."

"Already for many years, this second Sunday after Easter has been known as **Good Shepherd Sunday**. This Divine Shepherd today makes a doubly affectionate boast, which is that He knows and He cares: 'I know mine and mine know me.' We human beings crave for someone to understand us, but here on earth we rarely meet anyone who really does. Even brother or sister, man or wife, woefully fail to understand one another. 'Come to me ye laden and heavily burdened' says the Good Shepherd, 'and I shall give you rest,' for I know you through and through; ere you have uttered a word, you have told Me your tale. As God, I know you because I made you. As man I know you because I took a human soul and body. 'I care' He says, and for proof He can always show you His cross. When in trouble, the crowd runs away from you, but when left alone with your anxiety, your pain, your sorrow, Someone remains because He cares, He cares for what you are in yourself, not for what He might gain from you. ~Rev. J.P. Arendzen, 1935
