Modesty in Church Out of respect for our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests For the living, dead or special intentions- \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month, which is today. The next blessing will be June 7th, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Surely you must remember the **S A T**'s from grade school and high school? Their very mention always caused a gulp and wide-eyed expression, and reasonably so. You'll be pleased to know they haven't gone away. The Stanford University Test Series or SAT's (which we administer at PPA) are generally regarded to be the more difficult of other tests of this variety and are felt to give a more accurate indication of a student's true academic achievement level. It was but a few weeks ago that our Padre Pio Academy students sat for their SAT exams. Considering that some of our students may have been at a remedial level upon entering Padre Pio Academy, we feel that the final results are not only significant, but a true reflection of the quality of teachers, curriculum, and learning environment offered here. The exams were administered in the sixth academic month, thus the grade level is for example "5.6". The Average Grade Equivalent (or "score") in this case is "8.0". That is to say, PPA 5th graders scored at the 8th grade level! The following results are the average of all our students in their particular grades based on their test scores in all subjects:
