Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests For the living, dead or special intentions- \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month. The next blessing will be July 5th, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Sunday Within the Octave of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

A reflection on the Feast of the Sacred Heart by Dom Columba Marmion (1858-1923) Abbot of Maredsous: There is one feast which by its object brings to our mind, in a general manner, the love that the Incarnate Word has shown towards us: it is the Feast of the Sacred Heart. It is with this Feast that the Church, according to the revelation of Our Lord to St. Margaret Mary, closes, so to speak, the annual cycle of the solemnities of the Savior; it is as if, arrived at the term of the contemplation of her Bridegroom's mysteries, there is nothing left for her to do but to celebrate the very love that inspired them all.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is, in a general manner, devotion to the Person of Jesus Himself, manifesting His love for us and showing us His Heart as a symbol of this love. Who do we then Honor in this devotion? Christ Jesus Himself, in person. But what is the immediate special, proper object of this devotion? The Heart of flesh of Jesus, the Heart which beats for us in the bosom of the God-man; but we do not honor it apart from the human nature of Jesus, nor from the person of the Eternal Word to Whom this human nature was united at the Incarnation. Finally, we honor this Heart as the symbol of the love of Jesus towards us.

Each action done out of pure love is an act of pure love of God, and the more this act costs you, the greater and more meritorious is the love. Thus it was upon the cross that Our Lord showed most love. But where are we to find this pure love? We have it neither *of ourselves* nor *in ourselves*. We shall find it in the Sacred Heart of Jesus which is an infinite furnace of love, and when you receive this Sacred Heart in Holy Communion, you have only to place *your* Heart in the center of this Divine Heart in order to love with Its love. Oh yes! The Sacred Heart is an infinite treasury of Divine Love, and this Heart *is ours, It abides always in us*. "He that eateth My flesh, and drinketh My blood, abideth in Me, and I in Him." Unite yourself then very often with the Sacred Heart, and love with It and by It. This is a *great secret*.

Here are the words of St. Ambrose: "The mouth of Jesus on the cross has become our mouth, and with it we speak to the Father to appease His wrath: His Heart pierced by the lance has become our heart and with it we love the Father."

**Cogitationes Cordis ejus in generatione et generationem:
ut eruat a morte animas eorum
et alat eos
in fame**

The thoughts of His Heart are from generation to generation: that He may deliver their souls from death, and to feed those who hunger
