Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests For the living, dead or special intentions- \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. We maintain no association whatsoever with Kentucky Resistance.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each. The next blessing will be August 2nd, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Rome wasn't built nor seen in a day! The Spanish Steps ~ Comprised of 135 magnificent travertine steps, they connect the piazza at the base to Trinita dei Monti Church at the top. Ascending, the wide and curving staircase draws the eye upward to the Church. From the pinnacle, the Spanish Square stretches out below, and the view goes beyond to the horizon, with Roman rooftops, domes and belltowers as far as the eye can see.

The Basilica of the Sacred Heart ~ The Mother Church of the Salesian Order, whose construction began under Leo XIII in the late 1870's with the help of St. John Bosco who collected the funds for the new basilica. A Salesian himself, Bosco was a devotee of the Virgin Mary under the title, *Mary Help of Christians*. The bell tower remained incomplete until former Salesian pupils donated the imposing golden statue of the Sacred Heart which looks down on the city from high above.

The Scala Santa ~ That is, the Holy Stairs, were the steps leading up to the Praetorium of Pontius Pilate in Jerusalem on which Jesus stepped on His way to trial during His passion. They were brought to Rome by St. Helena in the fourth century and were known as the Stairs of Pilate. They are a popular place of pilgrimage and may only be ascended on one's knee's, thereby, incidentally, gaining the usual indulgence.

Abbey of Tre Fontaine ~ belongs to the Trappists. The main church of three is the Church of St. Paul of Three Fountains which was raised on the spot where St. Paul of Tarsus was beheaded by order of Nero. Legend accounts for the three springs (Tre Fontaine) asserting that when severed from Paul's body, his head bounced and struck the earth in three different places, from each a fountain springing forth. These still flow and are located in the sanctuary. These same Trappists raise the lambs whose wool is used to weave the palliums which are blessed by the pope and given to the new metropolitan archbishops on the Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul, June 29.

These Holy Places and more were visited by our PPA High School Pilgrims in conjunction with St. Thomas More School in San Jose.
