Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests For the living, dead or special intentions- \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. To register and receive offering envelopes, see the sign-up in the gift shop.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month, which is today. The next blessing will be September 6th, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Meanwhile, we continue the Roman Pilgrimage as seen by our Padre Pio Academy senior students ~ The Catacomb of St. Sebastian: Found near the Appian Way, this very chilly underground graveyard has been so-named since the Early Middle Ages. Prior to that, it was, "in memoria apostolorum" referring to the presence of the relics of the Apostles Peter and Paul found for quite some time within this holy ground. Due to archaeological excavations, there appeared three levels of galleries in which the catacombs lie. While most graves are humble, some from the earlier Roman pagan times are monumental tombs. Buried within, although often in now unidentified graves, are Saints Sebastian, whose feast is January 20, the day of his martyrdom and entombment; Ambrose, a soldier from Milan, martyred in Rome during the Diocletian persecution; Quirinus, Bishop of Sescia; and Eutychius, about whom nothing is known but his grave, discovered in the recent excavations.

The Sistine Chapel ~ Takes its name from Pope Sixtus IV who had it built in the 1480's. This "great chapel" is found in the Apostolic Palace, the pope's official residence in Vatican City. It is perhaps most widely known for its use for the papal conclave, when a new pope is elected. Famous for its plain exterior and incredible artistic interior, featuring Michelangelo's Last Judgement on the altar wall, and the 12,000 square-foot ceiling frescoed with scenes from Genesis. The most awesome of these would be the Creation of Adam, and fifteen side wall frescoes by Botticelli and Perugino depicting the lives of Moses and Christ, as well as many, many portraits of early popes. The first Mass in the Sistine Chapel was celebrated on August 15, 1483, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin, at which ceremony, the Chapel was consecrated and dedicated to the Virgin Mary. The Sistine Chapel has maintained its function to the present day and continues to host the important services of the Papal Calendar. There is even a permanent choir, for whom much original music has been written.

Our Padre Pio Academy students (and their parents) work very hard throughout the year at various campus devices to raise money for these biennial Pilgrimages which, we hope, may inspire them with a love and thirst for all things Catholic both now and throughout their lives.
