Modesty in Church Out of respect to our Lord, we beg all to appear in church modestly dressed. No shorts allowed. Ladies heads must be covered, no slacks or pants, low cut or sleeveless tops. Your cooperation is evidence of your love for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and respect for the House of God.

Communion Fast Holy Communion may be received only by Catholics believing themselves to be in the state of Sanctifying Grace, who are observing at least one hour fast prior to reception of the Sacrament. We are urged, however, to observe the fast from midnight, or, at least for three hours. While always welcome, non-Catholics and those who do not accept the traditional teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals, are NOT to receive Communion at this Mass. To receive Holy Communion do so in silence- do not say Amen.

Confession Procedure Begin your confession with "BLESS me Father for I have sinned", when you have received your penance, immediately begin your Act of Contrition.

Mass Requests For the living, dead or special intentions- \$20 stipend per Mass, intention box located on the wall in the gift shop.

Chapel Etiquette Food, drink, cell phones and matches are not allowed. Please use the butane lighters to light the votive candles. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, genuflect on both knees and bow. Otherwise, genuflect with the RIGHT knee touching the floor.

OLHC is an independent Traditional Chapel. To register and receive personal offering envelopes, see the sign-up in the gift shop.

No unapproved literature may be left on the premises. It will be discarded.

Need something blessed? The first Sunday of each month. The next blessing will be September 6th, please be there to pick up your item, it will not be held.

Saint Emigdius, (martyred 309) was a convert renown for miracles during his lifetime. He was sent as a bishop to Ascoli Piceno, Italy, where he was beheaded for his faith and is there interred. In 1703 a violent earthquake hit the region, but failed to affect Ascoli, a wonder attributed to the Saint's intercession against earthquakes. St. Emigdius was celebrated locally as co-patron of the Diocese of Monterey~Los Angeles under Bishop John J. Cantwell, at least as early as 1922 where his feast day is (was) observed on August 9, with an entire proper office.

Prayer to St. Emigdius Bishop and Martyr, special advocate against the movement of the earth: That the Divine Mercy may free us from the scourge of earthquake through his saintly intercession; May the Lord bless you + guard you + and let His face shine upon you and have mercy upon you + turn His countenance toward you and give you peace and health. May the Lord bless + this house and all those who dwell herein and free them from the scourge of earthquake through the name and power of Jesus Christ. Amen. St. Emigdius, pray for us and defend us against the blows of earthquake in the name of Jesus of Nazareth. Amen. Sanctus Deus. Sanctus Fortis. Sanctus Immortalis. Miserere nobis.
